INTRODUCTION

Drawing is an important part of literary development. As children draw together they often tell stories and readily "read" their drawings to each other. Young children consider their drawings to be actual writing. Children can look at their drawings and clearly retell a story and convey quite a sophisticated meaning.

There is a neurobiological processing link between ability to draw and the ability to write. Drawing prepares the child for writing. As there is a strong link between the language system and the sensory-motor system, drawing will play an important part in developing the language capacity.

Scribbles are children's first purposeful creative attempts. They seem nothing more than tangled up lines. However at a close look, the scribbles have a form, they represent a creation. With a few simple lines they can be transformed into meaningful creations. Connecting the scribbling attempts with language will bring enjoyment and importance to children's creations.

Circles and circular movements are a big step in the creative development. Simple lines and circular shapes give the young artist the necessary means to create a piece of art.

Children often confront tough challenges in their drawings. The difficulty is partly caused by the child's limited motor coordination. However the biggest challenge is to find ways of drawing people, animals, things and events on the flat page. They have to analyse objects and actions into components. Some children are able to do it, some find that difficult as they have to have the capacity for imaginative problem-solving.

The artist used a simple child-like style of drawings to make it easy for any child to get involved in the process of improving each page to produce a piece of art to be proud of. It does not matter at what level of drawing the children are at, or on their artistic ability, the children are encouraged to use their imagination and skill successfully to finish the picture.

The activities are multipurpose. The children develop eye-hand coordination, drawing skills, writing readiness, imagination and planning skills. The activities enhance communication competence.

The settings are motivating, interesting and challenging. The children are given hints that make drawing easy and satisfying. The footnotes on each page are intended to guide the parent (teacher) to provide points of interest and encouragement to the young artist.

It is left to the child's imagination and skill to draw whatever is needed to make the whole scene complete. Some pictures are just started and left for the young artists to finish in their own style. There are some pages that guide the children step by step to produce a more complicated drawing and thus gain more skill to draw confidently harder pictures.

Having discovered a range of possibilities children can express their ideas with confidence and satisfaction. They will develop skills while they work, arranging, rearranging, deciding what to do next and how to do it. They will be able to carry out their own ideas and solve problems that arise in their own individual ways.

Encourage children to talk about the picture. Discuss the types of lines, shapes and colours they used or plan to use. Find out what materials the child wants to use, pencils, coloured pencils, wax crayons or oil pastels.


Give them encouragement, acknowledge their hard work and results.
